ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE APPOINTMENT OF NEW INTERNEE DESCENDANT REPRESENTATIVE TO THE ENDOWMENT COUNCIL OF THE CANADIAN FIRST WORLD WAR INTERNMENT RECOGNITION FUND

The Endowment Council wishes to announce that the Board of Directors of the Ukrainian Canadian Foundation of Taras Shevchenko has appointed Jerry Bayrak to the Endowment Council of the Canadian First World War Internment Recognition Fund (CFWWIRF) as the internee descendant representative for a one year term commencing on April 1, 2013. Mr. Barak's family members, which include his great grandmother Anna,



grandfather Nickoly, grandmother Felicia, and uncle Edward Hancharuk, were interned at the Spirit Lake internment camp. His mother, Mary (Hancharuk) Bayrak, was born at Spirit Lake and was the "last survivor" of the 24 internment camps across Canada.



On behalf of all the members of the Endowment Council, Chair Ivan Grbešić officially extended thanks and good wishes to Anne Sadelain (nee Doskoch), internee descendant representative, for her contributions to the work of the Endowment Council during her one-year term.
